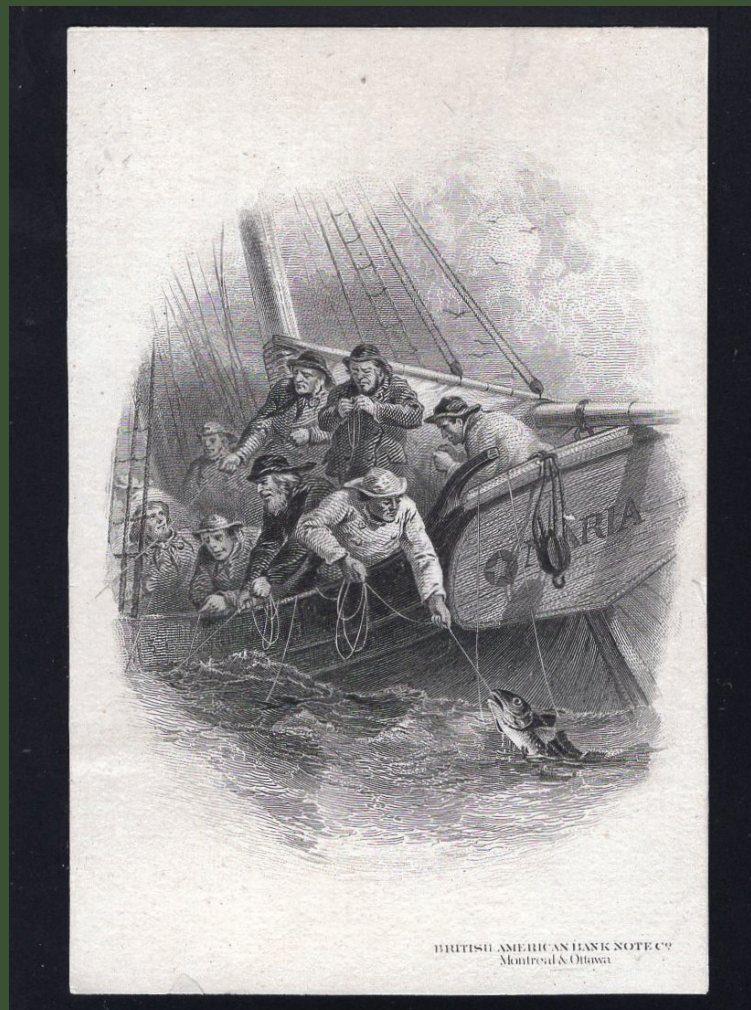

- 1 **\*/(\*) #14, 14b, 14ii 1859 1c Rose Queen Victoria**, three different mint stamps identified by owner as being #s 14 (perf. 12, full original gum, hinged and fine), 14b (brown red, perf. 12 x 11¾, full original gum, hinged and fine) and 14ii (unused no gum, on somewhat thicker paper, perf. 11¾, fresh and fine with a pulled perf.).

- 2 **E/P #19TC, 19TCii Two Different 17c Jacques Cartier Plate Proofs, in Pale Blue and Orange**, both on India paper and very fine.

- 3 **\* #19 1859 17c Blue Jacques Cartier**, mint with original hinged gum, with bright colour and a crisp impression, with lightly soiled perfs at top, still fine.

### Large Queen Issue - Scott #21-33

- 4 **E/P Proposed Large Queen Design Essay on Postal Card**, the “unfinished design” printed in black on buff card stock measuring 139 x 73 mm. It is surmised that in or around 1896, the ABN Co. revived the use of the old proposed stamp design from 1867 in a bid to win a contract to design and print the Jubilee postal card. An elusive and very fine item, Webb #P-E5. Ex Harrison and Fawn.

- 5 **E/P Undenominated Master Die Essay**, a rejected design showing the Queen facing left, prior to engraving value tablets and name, printed by the BABN Co. on white wove paper mounted on grey card, with “76” die number below, and the word “Soft” in light pencil at top. Surface scuff at upper right and light stain at right, still a lovely design and rare item, with only two known.

- 6 **E/P #21DP ½c Large Queen Large Trial Colour Die Proof in Dark Green**, on India paper measuring 43 x 50 mm, with geometric lathework across bottom measuring 5mm high. Tear at upper left, still a remarkable and desirable item. Very fine appearance, ex Legett, Lum, Gordon, Fawn. Minuse & Pratt #21TC1.

- 7 **E/P #21DP ½c Large Queen Trial Colour Die Proof in Red**, on thin card measuring 22 x 27 mm. From the BABN Co. trade sample sheet, rare and very fine. Minuse & Pratt 21P9.

- 9 **E/P #21P ½c Large Queen Plate Proof in Black**, a left margin block of four (pos. 21-22 / 31-32) printed on card, showing a tiny portion of the plate imprint at bottom left. The two stamps at right show traces of an engraver’s slip at top and spur at left. A scarce Large Queen proof multiple, very fine.

- 10 **E/P #21P ½c Large Queen Plate Proof in Black**, a single printed on card, showing a strong spur at left, four large and even margins, very fine.

13 **☒ #21 ½c Black Large Queen Strip of Six on Cover**, a cross-border cover addressed to Michigan, franked with a lovely horizontal plate strip of 6 of the ½c Large Queen (very lightly tied by unreadable c.d.s.), showing the plate imprint across the whole length of the right selvedge, slightly reduced at right, still very fine. A nice cover.

14 **\*/\* #21, 21iv, 21v 1868 ½c Black Large Queen with “Spur” and “H Spur” Varieties**, a mint horizontal strip from positions 1-5 with full og (stamps 3 and 4 are never hinged), showing a clear “H spur” in position 4, and “spur” in positions 2 and 3, overall fine.

15 **☒ #21a, 21iv, 21v ½c Black Large Queen with “Spur” and “H Spur” on 1888 Cover**, a 1c blue Queen Victoria stationery cover overprinted “SERVICE” plus a Coat of Arms by Henry Hechler, mailed Halifax on JUN.27.1888 (?) to Halifax, surcharged with a pair of ½c Large Queen stamps (both perf. 11½ x 12, paying the local 2c delivery fee) from positions 3 and 4, showing the “spur” and “H spur” varieties se-tenant. A very fine cover showing two clear printing varieties.

16 **⊙ #21c 1868 ½c Black Large Queen on Thin Paper with Narrow and Wide Spacing**, a used strip of four with vertical perforations resulting in narrow and wide spacing between stamps. Overall fine to very fine.

17 **\* #21iv 1868 ½c Black Large Queen**, a mint block of four with full original gum, lightly hinged. All four stamps show the spur at left variety, fresh and overall fine.

18 **\* #21iv 1868 ½c Grey Black Large Queen**, a mint block of four with full original gum, hinged. All four stamps show the spur at left variety, most noticeable on the left stamps, fresh and overall fine.

19 **☒ #21ix ½c Black Large Queen with Major Re-Entry on 1883 Cover**, mailed Newton Robinson, ON (only recorded strike of this Simcoe county instrument, and earliest postmark for town) on APR.9.1883 to Indiana (APR.12 Codland Ind. transit on back). Franked with a 2c Small Queen and two ½c Large Queens, with left one showing a clear major re-entry from position 1. A late usage of this issue, as the ½c Small Queen had been issued roughly 9 months earlier. Brigham owner’s handstamp on back and small faults, still very fine and scarce.

20 **(\*) #21viii 1868 ½c Black Large Queen with Vertical Stitch Watermark, Perforated 12**, unused (no gum), showing a prominent vertical stitch watermark at right, slightly nibbed perfs at top right, still fine and rare. Only valued as used in Unitrade. Accompanied by a 2008 Greene Foundation certificate.

21 **⊙/\* #21, etc. Collection and Study of the ½c Large Queen Issues**, with a good variety of items, including four mint hinged, six unused (no gum), mint never hinged, four stamps chosen to illustrate Duckworth papers (2, 3, 9, 10), one that is “double dated”, two with “prepaid to publisher” handstamps, one with three varieties (chignon, spur and engraver’s slip), a strip of 5, one with a 2-ring #3 and four that are perforated 11½ x 12. A few tiny faults, still overall fine to very fine and quite a useful group.

- 22 **\* / ⊙ #21 var Collection of ½c Large Queen Plate Varieties**, on 10 pages, includes 22 mint and used constant plate varieties, plus another 3 with constancy unproven. Most varieties are identified by plate position, with good blow-up scans of the variety, and includes the major re-entry, the H spur, spur, dot in D, dot in E, dots in T, white chignon, engraver's slip and others. Overall fine or better, a difficult group to assemble.

- 23 **E/P #22DP 1c Large Queen Trial Colour Die Proof in Dark Blue**, on India paper measuring 26 x 29 mm, with deep, rich colour and tremendous eye appeal. A very fine and attractive item, with great provenance including Bertram (1959), Law (1970), Firth (1971), Lindsey (1988) and Tang (2006).

- 34 **⊙ #22 1c Brown Red Large Queen Dated MAR.28.1868**, three days before the first official day of issue APR.1.1868, an indistinct cancel with a fairly easily readable date, couple of shorter perfs, else fine.

- 35 **⊙ #22 1c Brown Red Large Queen Dated MAR.31.1868**, the day before the first official day of issue APR.1.1868, an indistinct cancel with a fairly easily readable date, fine-very fine.

- 36 ☒ **#22 1c Large Queen on a MAR.28.1868 Printed Circular**, mailed from York ONT on MAR.28.1868, three days before the official issue date of the 1c brown red Large Queen of APR.1.1868. The stamp is cancelled by a concentric rings cancel and not tied, but appears to belong, as there are no other rate markings. The item is a larger folded printed circular which only retains a very small part of the printed message. Sold as is.

37 ☉ **#22a 1868 1c Brown Red Large Queen on Watermarked Bothwell Paper**, used with JAN.21.1869 c.d.s. from Québec City, showing letters "MIL" of the watermark, fine-very fine and fresh.

38 ☉ **#22a 1868 1c Brown Red Large Queen on Watermarked Bothwell Paper**, used with light "PAID" cancel, showing parts of four letters of the watermark, a pulled perf at bottom does not detract from this otherwise fresh and very fine stamp.

43 ☉ **#22, 23 1c Large Queen Study of Dot Placements**, a page showing six 1c Large Queens (3x brown reds and 3x yellow oranges), showing "proof positive that both shades were sometimes printed from the same plate, pp 5/6". We note useful postmarks such as a Montréal duplex (SEP.19.1868), a socked on the nose 4-ring #52 (Clifton) on a very fine centered #22b, a fancy geometric cork on a pair of #23, and a watermarked 1c brown red stamp showing two complete letters of the watermark. A useful page for the specialist, overall fine.

44 ☉ **#22, 23 var Collection of 1c Large Queen Plate Varieties**, neatly written-up on 10 pages, including 21 stamps with constant plate varieties, plus 4 more with constancy unproven. The varieties are all clearly identified with the aid of blow-up scans and we note burr to left of head (22iii), two dots in N, temple flaw, grave accent in C, apostrophe in C, central scratch in lower margin, bottom margin scratch, spur in lower margin, ink flaws in left margin, etc. There is a good showing of shades, plus some useful postmarks, including a lovely piece with a 2c LQ cancelled double ring "H & A.R. / N.S / East / SP.3.1870" (first day of use), 2 ring numerals, a nice 4-ring #20 (Melbourne), etc. All pages scanned online, overall fine to very fine and a wonderful lot for the specialist.

45 \*/(\*)/☉ **#22, 31, etc Collection and Study of the 1c Brown Red Large Queen Issues**, with a good variety of items, including two unused (no gum), two mint hinged, 4 stamps depicting a range of shades, a Toronto unofficial duplex, a bogus Bogey Head cancel, a "burr to left of head" variety, an 1858 date error, a strip of three, a few town cancels (including one that is trimmed-down), 6 stamps (incl. a pair) showing letters of the Bothwell watermark, and 4 stamps showing various Duckworth papers (1, 4, 5 faulty laid, 6 Bothwell). A few have faults else an overall fine to very fine and useful group. 29 stamps in all.

The cover is franked with a very fine horizontal strip of three of the 1c yellow orange (blind perfs between stamp 2 and 3), with the "grave accent in C" constant plate variety appearing on the right stamp. Faults on back, still a scarce variety on cover.

Force" also in green also with "No. 4 Staty Hospital (Laval) / Shornecliffe" manuscript in green. Presumably the person could not be found, and so there is a "Halifax / Can" manuscript notation in green, and finally an AUG.20 Halifax c.d.s. receiver on back. Opened on three sides for display, still a fascinating cover (especially with all its green markings), with rare usage of the OX4 stamps, a must have for the Admiral collector "who has everything". Accompanied by a 2015 Greene Foundation certificate.

We estimate about 900 covers and cards, generally ranging from the 1920s to the 1990s. plus roughly 4,000 stamps on and off paper and pieces, ranging from the late 1890s to the 1990s. All the postmarks are displayed in alphabetical order (Abbotsford to Zeballos), and we note a very wide variety of post offices, as well as many different types of postmarks within, including broken circles, c.d.s., rollers, duplex, MOON, MOTO, POCAN, a few slogans and other markings such as registration boxes, instructional markings, parcel handstamps, etc. The pages also include photographs of post offices, along with post office information including openings, closings, name changes, etc. There are too many post offices of note to list here, but our online pictures show a small sampling of the collection. An extensive collection with several socked on the nose cancels, ideal for the postmark collector, overall fine to very fine.

A 2% per month fee will be charged on delinquent balances until the full amount has been paid, and late payers agree to pay all fees incurred by GCPA to recover unpaid balances.
6. The buyer is responsible for the insurance and delivery of their purchased lots and will be charged actual shipping costs. Proof of mailing shall constitute delivery. GCPA will use the least expensive and most secure shipping method, unless the buyer expresses a preference at purchase time, preferably before the invoicing has been sent. Purchases will be mailed only once payment has been received unless prior arrangement has been made.
7. Each lot is sold as genuine and is described to the best of our knowledge and opinion. A lot cannot be returned if it meets any of the following criteria:
  - It contains 10 or more stamps or items.
  - It is pictured online, and a fault can clearly be seen (bidders who have not seen the material in person are responsible to carefully view our high-quality online scans before bidding).
  - It has been described as including faults or other problems.
  - It is described as "as is" or "mixed quality" or the word "appearing" is used following an adjective, such as "fine appearing".
  - It is accompanied by a certificate from a recognized entity dated 7 years or less.
  - It has been viewed in person by the buyer in advance of the auction.
8. If a discrepancy in a lot description has been discovered before it is auctioned, GCPA will post a description of the discrepancy on the GCPA website and also announce it verbally at time of auction. It is the buyer's responsibility to be aware of this before bidding.
9. Lots can be returned only if they are incorrectly described, within 14 days of receipt, by first contacting us

with the details of the problem, and then sending it to us in its original packaging by registered mail. If an extension is requested, the 14-day time limit will be extended.

10. Buyers can ask for an external opinion on a lot won (called an extension), by an authority known to us, as long as all of the following criteria are met.
  - The request must be made to GCPA before invoicing of the lot
  - Payment of both the lot and its certificate fees must be made in full before GCPA will send it directly to one of the approved authorities listed below (a refund will be issued in the event of an unfavorable opinion)
  - The following are GCPA approved authorities: the Vincent Greene Foundation (Canada and BNA), the Philatelic Foundation (USA and worldwide) and the BPA or RPSL (British Commonwealth).
  - Extension requests can include a request for a grading, but grading by itself cannot be used as a return criteria.
  
11. Valuations. All lots are described with either a catalogue value (always stating which catalogue was used) or a face value (in the country's currency), or estimate "Est." which is our best estimation as to what the lot should sell for on a normal day at auction. Estimates are also used on items that are either not catalogued, or for large lots, or postal history, or items for which a catalogue value is irrelevant, etc. For Canadian stamps, we use Unitrade values for single items or sets (as long as all the items in the set are centered the same). For collections, we use the Scott catalogue value (in US\$) as it only lists one centering / quality level. Each sale overview will be accompanied by a list of the specific catalogues used in that sale. The term "owner's catalogue value" is just that, and not verified by us, and the same applies to "identified by owner as", etc.
  
12. Quality for a lot is usually described as fine, very fine, extremely fine, and for single items, these terms will usually apply to the centering, and faults, if present, will be described in words. Used or un gummed stamps cannot be returned for having a hinge. In the case where there are several items in a lot, or stamp multiples, we can use the term "overall" to give an idea of the predominant condition. For postal history, it is normal to see small faults on most 19th century covers, or at least one filing crease on folded letters. Significant faults will usually be mentioned, especially if we feel it will affect the desirability of an item, and therefore early postal history is not returnable for normal small faults. Items sold for the postmark are not returnable for faults (usually described if significant) on the supporting item (cover, stamp, etc.), and cannot be sent for extension.
  
13. Bidding Increments (bids provided to us prior to the auction not conforming to these increments will be rounded down to the next increment):
