- The Ian Mowat extensive collection of Eastern Arctic mail in the form of a gold award-winning 8 frame exhibit, sold in 64 lots. This offering is probably the best ever assembled and has the distinction of including mostly commercial covers mailed in the Eastern Arctic.
- Selected material from the John (Jan) van der Ven collection of Canadian first day covers
- Lovely collections of Great Britain, New Zealand and Australia (and States) stamps.
- A rare and desirable 1919 Hawker Trans-Atlantic Flight cover
- Extensive and well researched collection of Canadian and worldwide military postal history in 40 volumes, including worldwide censor mail in 13 volumes, Canadian World War I in 6 volumes, etc.

Pence Issue - Scott #1-13

- 1 **E/P One Penny Queen Victoria Essay by Bradbury, Wilkinson & Sons**, in a lovely pastel blue shade, with Queen facing right, very fine.

- 2 ☉ **#1 1851 3d Red Beaver Imperforate on Laid Paper**, a used horizontal pair, with two concentric ring target cancels. Bit of sulphuretting at left of left stamp, still a fine pair of Canada's first stamp issue. Accompanied by a 2013 Richard Gratton AIEP certificate.

- 3 ☉ **#2 1851 6d Slate Violet Consort Imperforate on Laid Paper**, used with neat concentric ring cancel, a fresh stamp with four clear margins, close on two sides, fine-very fine.

- 4 ☉ **#4xiii 1852 3d Red Beaver Imperforate, with Major Re-Entry**, used, with "16" in grid cancel from Hamilton, showing a plate imprint along the entire length of the right margin. This major re-entry is from position 80, plate A, and shows doubling of the lower left "3", a horizontal line above the upper left "3" and doubling in many letters, especially "EE PEN", a position dot in the centre of the lower margin, etc. A remarkable stamp with its large margins (just touching lower left) and deep colour, fine.

- 5 ☉ **#5b 1855 6d Greenish Grey Consort Imperforate**, used with a light blue cancel, a fresh stamp with four large margins, very fine. A very nice stamp which is accompanied by a 2016 Greene Foundation certificate.

- 6 ☉ **#5d 1855 6d Grey Violet Consort Imperforate on Thick, Hard Paper**, used with light centrally struck cancel, a large stamp, with three huge margins, well clear at bottom, quite fresh and very fine. A very nice example of this scarcer paper variety.

- 7 ☉ **#7 1855 10d Blue Cartier Imperforate on Thin, Crisp Paper**, used with ring cancel and four large to very large margins, very fine. Accompanied by a 2018 Greene Foundation certificate.

- 8 ☉ **#7a/iii 1855 10d Blue Cartier Imperforate on Thick White Opaque Paper, with Major Re-Entry**, from plate position 1, used with concentric ring cancel leaving the re-entry clear, the stamp has two large to huge margins, plus two that are well clear. There is a clear re-entry at bottom of letters "ANAD", fine-very fine. Accompanied by a 1960 PF certificate erroneously describing it as being from position 29 (and not mentioning the scarcer paper variety).

- 9 ☉ **#8 1857 ½d Rose Queen Victoria Imperforate**, used with a very light cancel (almost looks unused) and four large and even margins, extremely fine. A very nice stamp with great eye appeal. Accompanied by a 2004 Richard Gratton AIEP certificate.

- 10 ☉ **#11 1858 ½d Rose Queen Victoria, Perforated 11¾** , used with a light grid cancel, with fresh colour and perforations clear of design on all sides, very fine. A lovely example of this difficult stamp. Accompanied by a 1988 Greene Foundation certificate.

Cents Issue - Scott #14-20

- 11 ☉ **#14 Old Time Accumulation of 1c Queen Victoria Stamps**, with 96 used stamps that were kept for decades in an old envelope. Unchecked by us for varieties, re-entries, papers, etc., but we note various shades, as well as a few with interesting postmarks. Most have small faults (pulled perfs, thins, etc.) still several are fine. A useful lot for the specialist.

Estimate \$150

- 12 * **#15 1859 5c Vermilion Beaver**, a mint horizontal strip of three, with full original gum and two hinge remnants. A fresh strip, with bright colour, fine. Any mint multiple of this stamp is scarce.

Unitrade \$3,000

- 13 ☉ **#15 Old Time Accumulation of 5c Beaver Stamps**, with 235 used stamps that were kept for decades in an old envelope. Unchecked by us for varieties, re-entries, etc., but we note various shades, some stamps with margin imprints, as well as a handful of 4-ring numerals such as #s 2 (Belleville in blue, RF 3), 4 (Bowmanville, RF 6), 7 (Collingwood, RF 4), 25 (Oshawa, RF 5), 29 (Perth, RF 4), 47 (Three Rivers, RF 4), 49 (Whitby in blue, RF3), and others, not to mention several with dated town cancels. Most have small faults (pulled perfs, thins, clipped perfs, etc.) still some are fine. A useful lot for the specialist.

- 14 ☉ **#17 Old Time Accumulation of 10c Consort Stamps**, with 24 used stamps that were kept for decades in an old envelope. Unchecked by us for varieties, re-entries, etc., but we note various shades, as well as two with 4-ring numeral #s 31 (Picton, RF 4) and 19 (or 49?) in what appears to be blue ink. Most have small faults (pulled perfs, thins, etc.) still some are fine. A useful lot for the specialist.

- 15 ☉ **#18 1859 12½c Deep Green Queen Victoria Pair on Large Piece of Double-Weight Envelope to England**, a beautiful and well centered pair (printing order 1B, positions 43-44) possessing the typical dark green shade of the very early printings, with centrally-struck target cancel, on large portion of an envelope having been despatched from Lennoxville C.E on SEP.16.1859, with Wellington (SEP.30) and Wivelscombe (Somerset, OCT.1) backstamps, as well as a Liverpool SEP.28 transit on front. "Ex Laycock" notation on album page.

- 16 **E/P #19TC 17c Cartier Trial Colour Plate Proof in Pale Blue**, a lower sheet margin single, printed on card-mounted India paper, tiny mark in upper left margin, else very fine.

- 17 (*)/☉ **#4/20i Group of Used and Unused First Cents Issues**, starts with 1c (two unused and one used), 5c (two used), 10c (used with 4-ring #49 in blue), 12½c (one unused and two used) and 2c (used rose shade and used claret). Also comes with two faulty 3d Beaver imperforates. Overall fine.

- 18 */(*) #15, 17, 19, 20 Group of 9 mint or Unused 1859 First Cents Issues, with #s 15, 17 (x6, with shades), 19 (probably reperforated) and 20. A few have original, or part original gum, rest are without gum, an overall fine group. Catalogue value is for all without gum only.

Large Queen Issue - Scott #21-33

- 19 E/P #22P 1c Large Queen Trial Colour Plate Proof in Black, printed on card, and as rare as the die proofs, as Duckworth reports having not seen any evidence of this, other than it being listed in Minuse & Pratt (22TC4). Very fine, and a must have for any serious Large Queen collector. Ex Fawn (2022), Hargreaves (2024).

- 20 ☉ #24a 1868 2c Green Large Queen on Watermarked Bothwell Paper, used with part 2-ring numeral cancels, showing a complete letter "E" of the watermark, very fine. Accompanied by a 2024 Richard Gratton AIEP certificate.

- 21 * #27v 1868 6c Brown Large Queen, a mint block of four with full original gum, sensibly hinged, bit of separation between two right stamps and a few irregular perfs at right, still fresh and fine. Accompanied by a 2016 Richard Gratton AIEP certificate. A rare multiple.

- 22 */** #29 1890s 15c Large Queen Shade Group, with three mint blocks of four, identified by owner as "greyish purple" (hinged), "rich greyish purple" (hinged) and "deep greyish purple" (never hinged with plate inscription at top). A fresh and overall fine group.

- 23 ☉ #31 1868 1c Brown Red Large Queen on Laid Paper, used with 4-ring numeral cancel, a very well centered stamp with rich colour but with thins and creases (called tears in the cert.), still with very fine appearance. Accompanied by a 2024 Greene Foundation certificate.

- 24 ☉ #21-30 Group of Used Large Queens, consisting of 61 stamps, from the 1/2c to the 15c, with each value present in between one and dozens of examples. We note several shades, a few thin paper varieties, a 2c on watermarked "MIL" paper, a few unused stamps, etc. One of the 12 1/2c stamps has a bad thin, rest appear to be overall fine or better.

Large Queen Postmarks - 2-Rings

- 25 ☉ 2-Ring #11 (Fredericton) Cancels on 7 Different Large Queen Stamps, with Scott #s 22, 23, 24, 25, 27, 28, 29. A few may have small faults, otherwise an overall fine collection with easily legible strikes.

- 26 ☉ 2-Ring #16 (Brockville, RF 8) and 18 (Yarmouth) Cancels on 5 Large Queen Stamps, #16 on Scott #s 25 and #18 on Scott #s 23, 25, 27, 28. A few may have small faults, otherwise an overall fine collection with fine strikes.

- 27 ☉ **2-Ring #21 (Goderich), 23 (Woodstock, RF 5) and 24 (Stratford, RF 4) Cancels on 11 Large Queen Stamps**, with 2-ring #21 on Scott #s 23, 24, 25, 27a, 2-ring #23 on Scott #s 22, 23, 24, 25, and 2-ring #24 on Scott #s 24, 25, 27. A few may have small faults, otherwise an overall fine collection with fine or better strikes.

- 34 ☉ **2-Ring #52 (St. Hyacinthe) and 53 (Three Rivers) Cancels on 7 Large Queen Stamps**, with 2-ring #52 on Scott #s 23, 24 (thin), 25, and 2-ring #53 on Scott #s 23, 25, 27 (pulled perf) and 29i. An overall fine group with many very fine strikes.

- 35 ☉ **2-Ring #s 55 (Berlin, RF 5) and 56 (Brampton, RF 6) on 7 Large Queen Stamps**, with 2-ring #55 on Scott #s 23a, 24, 25, 27 and 29, 2-ring 56 on Scott #s 23a and 25, a few stamps have blunt perfs, else an overall fine or better group with fine or better strikes.

- 36 ☉ **2-Ring #s 57 (Paris, RF 6) and 58 (St Thomas, RF 7) on 5 Large Queen Stamps**, with 2-ring #57 on Scott #s 23, 25 and 2-ring #58 on Scott #s 24, 25, 27a. A few stamps have blunt perfs, else an overall fine or better group with fine or better strikes.

37 © 2-Ring #60 (Newmarket, RF 5) Cancels on 4 Different Large Queen Stamps, with Scott #s 24, 25, 28 (crease) and 29. An overall fine or better group, with mostly complete and well centered strikes.

Small Queen Issue - Scott #34-47

38 */** #34 var 1890s ½c Black Small Queen, a mint gutter strip of 4 with vertical gutter in centre and sheet margin at bottom. One stamp is hinged, three others never hinged, with natural short gum. A fresh and very fine item which would look great in any Small Queen collection.

39 ** #35 1890s 1c Yellow Small Queen, a mint never hinged block of 6, with full original gum, fresh colour and fine-very fine overall. Accompanied by a 2024 Greene Foundation certificate.

40 ** #35 1890s 1c Yellow Small Queen, mint never hinged, with full original gum and four large margins. A lovely stamp with tremendous eye appeal, quite fresh and very fine. Accompanied by a 2024 Greene Foundation certificate.

41 */** #35 1890s 1c Yellow Small Queen, a mint plate inscription block of ten, with full original gum, showing part of the imprint in margin at top right. The upper right stamp is lightly hinged, rest are never hinged and the block has light diagonal natural gum bends, overall fine-very fine.

42 */** #35 1890s 1c Yellow Small Queen, a mint block of eight with full original gum, two lower middle stamps are lightly hinged, rest are never hinged. Light original gum bends / wrinkles and gum streaks, else over fine and fresh.

44 ** #36i 1890s 2c Green Small Queen, a mint never hinged block of four, with full original gum, very well centered and with deep fresh colour, very fine. The block also shows a strong offset on all four stamps. Accompanied by a 2024 Richard Gratton AIEP certificate.

45 * #36i 1890s 2c Deep Green Small Queen, a mint block of nine, showing part of counter "TWO" in margin at top, with full original gum. Separation between some stamps has been cleanly re-joined by small hinges, overall fine with lovely rich colour.

46 * #36i 1890s 2c Green Small Queen, a mint block of 15 with full original gum, separation in many places has been tended to by light hinging, fresh and overall fine-very fine.

- 47 ***/** #36i 1890s 2c Green Small Queen**, a mint block of six with full original gum, three stamps are hinged and three are never hinged, fresh and fine-very fine.

- 49 **⊙ #40i 1880s 10c Light Rose Lilac Small Queen**, a used block of four with bull's eye cancels, top stamps are well centered, overall fine-very fine. There is evidence of prior separation, which has been expertly re-joined (difficult to see), still a scarce used multiple.

- 50 *** #43 1890s 6c Red Brown Small Queen**, a mint upper right corner counter block of six, with full original hinged gum, showing complete "SIX CENTS" shaded counter in margin at top. Some separation, and lower right stamp has surface scuffs, still fine with bright colour.

- 51 *** #43i 1890 6c Chestnut Small Queen**, a mint plate inscription block of twelve showing a large part of the plate inscription in margin at bottom. Separation in places has been re-joined by hinges and there is gum dulling in places, still a fine block.

1897 Diamond Jubilee - Scott #50-65

- 57 Ⓞ **Collection of 527 Jubilee Stamps with Mostly Squared Circle Postmarks**, the majority are squared circles but there are also a few c.d.s. and Orbs. The towns present are Toronto (x20), Ottawa (x104), Brantford (x169), Ingersoll (x54), Prescott (x33), St Thomas (x59) and Windsor (x88). Most are displayed on pages by calendar date (sometimes with both AM and PM), with spaces for more, and we note that all are fully dated and there is a high degree of socked on the nose strikes, with a little duplication here and there. A great lot for dealers or collectors alike, see our representative photos online.

- 58 Ⓞ **#51, 53 Old Time Collection of Town Postmarks on Jubilee Stamps**, with 265 mostly 1c and 3c values. There is a large selection of different towns here (including several smaller and scarcer towns), from all provinces except Ontario and Québec, with postmark types including squared circles, C.D.S. and broken circles. Strikes vary from just identifiable to many gorgeous socked on the nose and fully dated. Overall fine to very fine, photos only show a portion of the lot.

- 59 Ⓞ **#51, 53 Collection of Owen Sound Ontario Squared Circle and C.D.S. Cancels on 95 Jubilee Stamps**, 39 are c.d.s. and the rest are squared circle, all arranged chronologically on pages (JUN.20.1897 to JAN.11.1898). All strikes appear to be fully dated, including time mark, overall very fine. All pages scanned online.

- 60 Ⓞ **#51, 53 Collection of Brockville Ontario Squared Circle Cancels on 189 Jubilee Stamps**, some are on a black stock page, rest are arranged chronologically on pages (JUN.21.1897 to NOV.23.1898). All strikes are fully dated and there is a very high percentage of lovely socked on the nose strikes, overall very fine. All pages scanned online.

- 61 Ⓞ **#51-53 Collection of 121 Fully Dated Orb Cancels on 1c to 3c Jubilees**, with Orb cancels from Toronto (x53) and Hamilton (x68), including a few different types for Toronto. We note that the majority of these cancels are socked on the nose, and all are fully dated (all 1897 dates, more or less in order), so would be ideal for a calendar collection. A much better than average lot of these, overall very fine.

- 62 Ⓞ **#53 1897 3c Jubilee with Fancy Flag Cancel**, a fine strike of Lacelle #1390, from the Notre Dame Street West (Montréal) office. This fancy cancel was designed to be used on the Jubilee issue in a manner as not to "deface" the Queens' faces. Rarely offered and comes with two Greene Foundation certificates (1981 and 1982).

The placing of a bid by any means shall constitute the acceptance of these Terms and Conditions.

1. All bids are conducted in Canadian dollars. The buyer shall pay a commission of 17% on the hammer price of all lots won. Canadian buyers will be charged applicable tax(es). British Columbia merchants can provide us with a provincial sales tax (PST) exemption number, which must be received before invoicing. Buyers outside Canada are responsible for all customs duties applied by their home country, and GCPA will not modify invoices for the purpose of avoiding such fees.
2. All lots will be sold to the highest bidder, at one increment over the next highest bid. In case of dispute, the auctioneer's bid book will take precedence over any other source.
3. All bids are per lot as numbered in the catalogue, and Garden City Philatelic Auctions Inc. (GCPA) reserves the right to withdraw any lot prior to the sale for any reason, as well as to refuse a bid, if it is deemed not to be made in good faith.
4. All lots remain the property of GCPA on behalf of the consignors until paid for in full.
5. Unless there is prior arrangement with the Auction Manager, all payments are due 30 days after invoice date, and can be remitted in one of many ways (see the "Payments" page on our website for more details). 8. If a discrepancy in a lot description has been discovered before it is auctioned, GCPA will post a description of the discrepancy on the GCPA website and also announce it verbally at time of auction. It is the buyer's responsibility to be aware of this before bidding.
9. Lots can be returned only if they are incorrectly described, within 14 days of receipt, by first contacting us with the details of the problem, and then sending it to us in its original packaging by registered mail. If an extension is requested, the 14-day time limit will be extended.

10. Buyers can ask for an external opinion on a lot won (called an extension), by an authority known to us, as long as all of the following criteria are met.
- The request must be made to GCPA before invoicing of the lot
 - Payment of both the lot and its certificate fees must be made in full before GCPA will send it directly to one of the approved authorities listed below (a refund will be issued in the event of an unfavorable opinion)
 - The following are GCPA approved authorities: the Vincent Greene Foundation (Canada and BNA), the Philatelic Foundation (USA and worldwide) and the BPA or RPSL (British Commonwealth).
 - Extension requests can include a request for a grading, but grading by itself cannot be used as a return criteria.
11. Valuations. All lots are described with either a catalogue value (always stating which catalogue was used) or a face value (in the country's currency), or estimate "Est." which is our best estimation as to what the lot should sell for on a normal day at auction. Estimates are also used on items that are either not catalogued, or for large lots, or postal history, or items for which a catalogue value is irrelevant, etc. For Canadian stamps, we use Unitrade values for single items or sets (as long as all the items in the set are centered the same). For collections, we use the Scott catalogue value (in US\$) as it only lists one centering / quality level. Each sale overview will be accompanied by a list of the specific catalogues used in that sale. The term "owner's catalogue value" is just that, and not verified by us, and the same applies to "identified by owner as", etc.
12. Quality for a lot is usually described as fine, very fine, extremely fine, and for single items, these terms will usually apply to the centering, and faults, if present, will be described in words. Used or ungummed stamps cannot be returned for having a hinge. In the case where there are several items in a lot, or stamp multiples, we can use the term "overall" to give an idea of the predominant condition. For postal history, it is normal to see small faults on most 19th century covers, or at least one filing crease on folded letters. Significant faults will usually be mentioned, especially if we feel it will affect the desirability of an item, and therefore early postal history is not returnable for normal small faults. Items sold for the postmark are not returnable for faults (usually described if significant) on the supporting item (cover, stamp, etc.), and cannot be sent for extension.
13. Bidding Increments (bids provided to us prior to the auction not conforming to these increments will be rounded down to the next increment):

\$50 – \$200 = \$10.00

\$200 – \$500 = \$25.00

\$500 – \$1,500 = \$50.00

\$1,500 – \$3,000 = \$100.00

\$3,000 – \$7,000 = \$200.00

\$7,000 – \$15,000 = \$500.00

\$15,000 – \$30,000 = \$1,000.00

\$30,000 – \$100,000 = \$2,000.00
