- 14      ☒      1849 Trafalgar (U.C.) Folded Letter to England, mailed on AUG.15.1849 (1829-type in black) to Penrith (SEP.3 receiver) through Toronto, Montréal and Pooley-Bridge. Fine-very fine.

- Early B.N.A. Postmarks**
- 15      ☒      1797 (June 17) Folded Letter from Detroit to Connecticut, datelined inside by the writer Daniel Bissell, addressed to John Wiles, a merchant in East Hartford, Connecticut. The letter entered the U.S. mails at Philadelphia, was rated "17" manuscript and dated July 25 by Franklin mark. Mailed during the period of Canadian control of Detroit, written in Fort Detroit, while in the Northwest Territory, and less than a year following the withdrawal by the British from the fort. Edge and fold faults, still a very fine early usage. A simple online search on Bissell reveals a very interesting life and career.

- 16      ☒      1801 Québec Ship Letter to England, datelined inside AUG.14.1801 and mailed with a very fine strike of the crowned "SHIP LETTER / QUEBEC" double oval (difficult to find these on outgoing mail, usually used on incoming) to Birmingham, England, via London (SEP.23 transit in red on back), endorsed "Pr. H. M. S. Eurydice". Very fine, and mounted on a well written-up page giving a full account of the rates and the ship it crossed on. Ex Steinhart.

- 17      ☒      1801 Niagara (U.C.) Straightline Cancel on Folded Cross-Border Cover, addressed to New York City and rated "25" (cents) manuscript, the front shows a very fine strike of "NIAGARA, Aug" (with the day "20" added by pen, year confirmed by docketing on back). A very fine example of this rare postmark, the office was established in 1797 as a convenience to handle U.S.-bound letters, the office forwarded mail on a biweekly basis to Fort Niagara (in the U.S.) which was less than a mile away across the Niagara River. Ex Meyer and "Dubois".

- 18      ☒      1801 Québec City Folded Letter to Scotland, mailed from Québec (large oval crown "Ship Letter / Quebec" in black) to Kincorth (near Aberdeen), with NOV.23.1801 partial Bishop mark on back and NO/26 receiver in red on front. A very fine early Trans-Atlantic letter.

- 19      ☒      1804 Berthier (L.C.) Straightline Cancel on Folded Cover addressed to Montréal and rated 4½ manuscript, the back shows a very fine strike of "BERTHIER / 27 MAR 180" (with the missing year digit confirmed by docketing). Very fine.

- 20      ☒      1818 Niagara (U.C.) "Belt Buckle" on Folded Letter To England, mailed JUN.11.1818 (Niagara / U. Canada "belt-buckle" in black) to London (AUG.1 receiver on back) through Québec and Liverpool, with boxed "Liverpool / Ship Letter" handstamp next to a tiny "Paid." handstamp, both in black. Some staining, still an interesting early Trans-Atlantic letter with a very fine strike of the scarce Niagara postmark.

- 21      ☒      1821 St John (N.B.) Fleuron on Folded Cover to Fredericton, mailed on OCT.6.1821 (fine strike of scarce Fleuron type) and rated 1sh2d, fine.

Straightline Cancel on Trans-Atlantic Folded Cover, a pre-printed cover apparently mailed from the Customs House in London, England, addressed to "His Excellency The Governor or Commander in Chief, New Brunswick" and rated "1N6" manuscript, with "ST ANDREWS / NEW BRUNSWICK" 2-line handstamp and "8 Apr 1828" manuscript date between the lines.

This rare postmark (only three examples are recorded) is recorded used between OCT.31.1828 and MAY.7.1829. Ex Cloutier exhibit.

- 27      ☒      1830 York (U.C.) Folded Cover to Fredericton N.B. mailed on DEC.17.1830 (large circle in red) to Fredericton N.B. (APR.5.1831 large broken circle receiver on front) through Québec City (DEC.28.1830 Fleuron-type transit) where a "FORWARDED" handstamp was applied. A manuscript "Refused" notation was applied upon arrival (a trip which took almost 4 months). A lovely and very fine folded cover.

- 29      ☒      1830 St Thomas (U.C.) Manuscript Postmark on Folded Letter to Sandwich, mailed on JAN.1.1830 (the only known example of this manuscript precursor postmark). Tape repairs on the inside, still a very fine example of this unique postmark. Ex Dr. Robert C. Smith.

- 30      ☒      1830 Québec City Folded Letter to England, mailed on MAR.18.1830 (Fleuron-type datestamp in red) with a "Quebec / PAID" handstamp in red with manuscript rate "1/2" inside, with "Postage paid to New York" manuscript notation and rectangular boxed "Ship Letter / Liverpool" on back. An overall fine cover with lots of rate interest.

- 31      ☒      Two York UP-CAN Large Circle Postmarks, first is a folded letter mailed from London, England on AUG.22.1830 (dateline inside and despatch c.d.s. on back) to Amherstburg, through Halifax (SEP.23 fleuron), Québec (SEP.27 fleuron), and York Up-Can (Oct.6 large circle), with two different boxed "FORWARDED" handstamps in red (one applied in Amherstburg and one in York). Second is a folded cover mailed from York on SEP.2.1830 (docketing on back provides year) to Montréal. Both are very fine.

- 32      ☒      1831 Folded Letter from Bristol to Québec City, mailed JUL.18.1831 (datelined inside, plus docketing on front) to Québec (SEP.10.1821 1829-type in red) alongside a fine small oval crowned Ship Letter / Quebec handstamp, also in red. The letter is endorsed "per William". Tape repairs inside, still a fine example of these scarce postmarks.

The letter inside is datelined "Paisley, 2 Sept 1831". A fine duo.

- 35      ☒      Two Early Folded Letters Mailed via Halifax (N.S.), first was mailed from Glasgow, Scotland to Pictou N.S., endorsed "Acadian" and entered the mails in Halifax (SEP.2.1835 small c.d.s. plus a large oval crown "SHIP LETTER / HALIFAX" postmarks), fine, with no letter inside. Second was mailed from Glasgow, Scotland on JUN.1.1836 (neat backstamp) to Québec City, with a Halifax small c.d.s. dated AUG.1.1836, very fine.

- 36      1838 Illustrated Broadsheet Announcing the Sailing of the Ship "Credo" from Dublin to Quebec City, originally printed to say it departed on April 21st, 1838, corrected by pen to the 24th. It describes that this is a fast ship that can accommodate passengers and goods, having lots of "good water and fuel" and much more. A rarely seen item, especially from this era, would look great in a Trans-Atlantic postal history collection.

Folded Money Letter to Toronto, mailed on APR.15.1838 (1829-type in red with month and day typeset, year confirmed in letter inside and docketing), with "1¼ OZ 4/7" rate markings and in interesting manuscript "M" in red cursive. Long letter inside indicates this would have enclosed £60, very fine.	Estimate \$100
38	✉ 1839 (May 27) Hamilton (U.C.) "Steamboat" Straightline on Folded Letter, mailed on MAY.27.1839 using the first type of Hamilton c.d.s. (with lettering very close to rim, this being one of only two recorded strikes in black as the rest are red). Interestingly, the only other example in black is also on a cover with the rare STEAMBOAT postmark. Addressed to Kingston, with manuscript "Paid", "PAID" handstamp in black and rated 11d manuscript in red.	Estimate \$200
39	✉ 1840s Kingston (N.B.) Star Cancel on Folded Cover, mailed in 1842 or 1843 to Fredericton N.B. (receiver on back has indistinct year), fine and scarce.	Estimate \$100
40	✉ 1842 Dalhousie (N.B.) Star Cancel on Folded Cover to Fredericton N.B., mailed on JUL.30.1842 (docketing on back), with a Dalhousie star cancel and a Dalhousie N.B. / PAID postmark with "2N6" rate inside. Repaired vertical split, else very fine strikes.	Estimate \$100
41	✉ 1842 "Steamboat Letter "Q" Oval Postmark, in red, dated JUL.12.1842 on a folded cover addressed to Montréal and rated "9" manuscript. Avery fine and seldom seen postmark.	Estimate \$100
42	✉ Three Stampless Letters with "Fredericton N.B. PAID" Postmarks, a folded cover mailed from Fredericton on SEP.14.1842 (c.d.s. in red on back) to Fredericton, with a "Fredericton.N.B. / PAID" double broken circle handstamp in red on front, enclosing a manuscript rate, also with a light third Fredericton datestamp on back. Also a small mourning cover with a APR.17.1853 "Fredericton.N.B. / PAID" handstamp in red, also enclosing a manuscript rate to Buctouche, with St John (APR.18) transit on back alongside a second indistinct datestamp. Last but not least is a folded cover from Fredericton to Springfield, with a JUN.28.1865 "Fredericton. N.B. / PAID" handstamp in brown, next to a "5 CENTS" rate handstamp also in brown, with Saint John JUN.29 transit on back. All three are very fine.	Estimate \$100

Schooner Experiment" and rated "9" manuscript (collect), very fine.	Estimate \$100

48	✉ 1851 Peterboro (U.C.) Cover to Ireland, mailed on SEP.16.1851 (double broken circle despatch) to Belfast, Ireland (OCT.8.1851 receiver in blue) via Cobourg (SEP.16 transit), Montreal (SEP.18.1851 transit) and London (OCT.7), rated "PAID" manuscript and handstamp in red, and manuscript "1/4 currency = 1/2 Sterling". Rated "8Stg PAID 10d Cy" handstamp in red and endorsed "Per Royal Mail Steamer", very fine. Written-up on two pages, one showing a picture of the Liverpool harbour circa 1840.

An orange boxed "CANADA / ART.19" handstamp was applied at the Foreign Branch, G.P.O. London (these applied on unpaid letters from Canada to France, Montgomery records only 8 examples). "Changeling" on Registered Cover to Toronto, also known as a "Ruggles" postmark, this JUN.24.1857 example is a very fine strike, clearly showing the two outer-rings that were once filled with lead to form a single ring, on a registered cover to Toronto (next day receiver on back), rated "PAID 3" handstamp in red. Probably the nicest example of this interesting postmark, in this state that we have seen, on a very fine cover. Ex Cloutier exhibit.

Missing back flap and other edge faults, else a scarce destination for this period.

A lovely small cover in the manner of a mourning cover, but with outlines in light blue (instead of black), very fine.

A rare postmark on a very fine cover.

A very fine strike of this scarce postmark, ex "Dubois" (Siegel, lot 2233, where it was described as "wonderful strike") and "Maritimus".

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

8. If a discrepancy in a lot description has been discovered before it is auctioned, GCPA will post a description of the discrepancy on the GCPA website and also announce it verbally at time of auction. It is the buyer's responsibility to be aware of this before bidding.
9. Lots can be returned only if they are incorrectly described, within 14 days of receipt, by first contacting us with the details of the problem, and then sending it to us in its original packaging by regis-

tered mail. If an extension is requested, the 14-day time limit will be extended.

10. Buyers can ask for an external opinion on a lot won (called an extension), by an authority known to us, as long as all of the following criteria are met.
  - The request must be made to GCPA before invoicing of the lot
  - Payment of both the lot and its certificate fees must be made in full before GCPA will send it directly to one of the approved authorities listed below (a refund will be issued in the event of an unfavorable opinion)
  - The following are GCPA approved authorities: the Vincent Greene Foundation (Canada and BNA), the Philatelic Foundation (USA and worldwide) and the BPA or RPSL (British Commonwealth).
  - Extension requests can include a request for a grading, but grading by itself cannot be used as a return criteria.
11. Valuations. All lots are described with either a catalogue value (always stating which catalogue was used) or a face value (in the country's currency), or estimate "Est." which is our best estimation as to what the lot should sell for on a normal day at auction. Estimates are also used on items that are either not catalogued, or for large lots, or postal history, or items for which a catalogue value is irrelevant, etc. For Canadian stamps, we use Unitrade values for single items or sets (as long as all the items in the set are centered the same). For collections, we use the Scott catalogue value (in US\$) as it only lists one centering / quality level. Each sale overview will be accompanied by a list of the specific catalogues used in that sale. The term "owner's catalogue value" is just that, and not verified by us, and the same applies to "identified by owner as", etc.
12. Quality for a lot is usually described as fine, very fine, extremely fine, and for single items, these terms will usually apply to the centering, and faults, if present, will be described in words. Used or ungummed stamps cannot be returned for having a hinge. In the case where there are several items in a lot, or stamp multiples, we can use the term "overall" to give an idea of the predominant condition. For postal history, it is normal to see small faults on most 19th century covers, or at least one filing crease on folded letters. Significant faults will usually be mentioned, especially if we feel it will affect the desirability of an item, and therefore early postal history is not returnable for normal small faults. Items sold for the postmark are not returnable for faults (usually described if significant) on the supporting item (cover, stamp, etc.), and cannot be sent for extension.
